For students entering our program with a master's degree, although Northwestern University does not accept transfer credits from other universities at the graduate level, under certain circumstances, the PhD program will accept a previously completed graduate course from another institution as satisfying a curricular requirement of the PhD program. All PhD students, however, must complete at least nine (9) quality letter-graded graduate level courses within Northwestern as part of meeting the Program's requirements for the PhD.

Given the current educational and training requirements of the program, time to completion is expected to be a minimum of 5 years.

All students in the Clinical Psychology PhD Program in the Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences receive a Research Assistant Scholarship or equivalent award that provides 100% tuition remission (or the equivalent) and a 12-month stipend (current stipend rates can be found here: <https://www.tgs.northwestern.edu/funding/index.html>). The tuition remission and monthly stipend are provided for 20 quarters, including four (4) academic years and four (4) summers, as well as a funding for a fifth (5th) academic year and summer as part of the fulltime clinical internship. Stipend funding for the internship year includes the stipend provided by the internship, as well as stipend support from the University that is necessary to bring the internship stipend up to the minimum stipend levels set by the graduate school, if necessary.

Students receive a full health insurance subsidy, if enrolled in the Northwestern Student Health Insurance Plan (NUSHIP), for the first four (4) academic years and four (4) summers. Please note that NUSHIP is active for 12 months, from the September 1 through the last day of August. Health insurance during the clinical internship year is provided by the internship site; the PhD program does not provide a health insurance subsidy during the internship year because most internship sites provide health insurance; however, interns are able to purchase the NUSHIP plan out-of-pocket.

Consistent with the requirements of our program, all (100%) students obtained one-year, full-time internships that are accredited by APA. None (0%) of our students applied for or obtained a non-accredited, APPIC non-accredited member, or other member organization (e.g., CAPIC) internships. Further, none (0%) of our students obtained two-year, half-time internships.

Our average internship placement rate (first attempt) is 93.9% (62/66) in the last 10 years for the first attempt. Students who were not successful on their first attempt (n=4), they all placed on their second attempt.
